

Physocarpus opulifolius - Growing Guide

Growing Physocarpus Opulifolius

Ninebark

P. opulifolius is closely related to *Spiraea* and *Neillia*. It is a medium sized, deciduous, and vigorous North American shrub which is fully hardy and grows to around 10ft when mature. It will grow in virtually any soil conditions and is a welcome addition to any shrub border or to a wilder woodland garden setting.

The named varieties of *P. opulifolius* are grown for their improved or different leaf colours and flowers. Most grow to around 6ft and are therefore somewhat smaller than the species itself.

'Dart's Gold' is a compact shrub with bright long lasting yellow foliage fading to green.

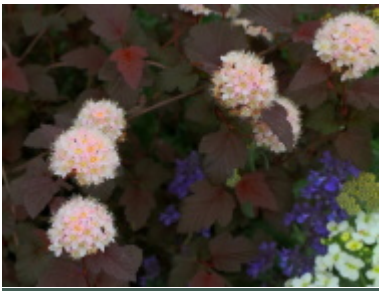

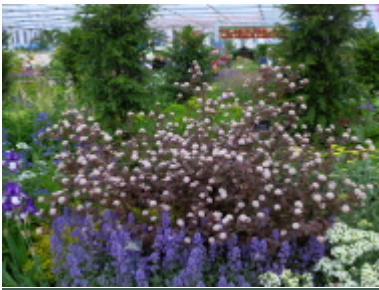
