

## Ajuga reptans - Growing Guide

### Growing Ajuga Reptans

#### Bugle

These are creeping evergreen plants which make excellent groundcover in more moist positions. They come from Iran and the Caucasus and are quite invasive. However the improved hybrid garden forms which we offer are less invasive and easily kept under control at the edge of a border, in a rockery or in gaps in a patio.

*A. reptans* varieties all produce dark blue flowers in spike-like whorls of about 6in in height in late spring or early summer. They have hairy stems, spoon shaped leaves and clumps will spread 2ft or more. These plants spread quickly by stolons or runners.

*A. reptans* 'Black Scallop' has attractive violet blue flowers set against dark black foliage. The leaves colour best in full sun.
